Appendix G - Judging Program Categories

IMPORTANT: The guidelines have been updated as the previously posted document grouped some categories together for a single judging school when that was not the original intent. The following should more clearly define the expectations.

These are the <u>minimum</u> suggested timeframes for judging schools for each of the following categories. A Judging School may be held over a longer period of time than indicated below, if desired.

1 Day Schools – 5 to 6 hrs of class time

- A) Field Crops (Small grains, corn, hay, legumes, etc.)
- **B)** Needle Crafts (Needlepoint, weaving, huck/Swedish weaving, tatting, cross stitch, embroidery, and other related crafts)

1/2 Day or Evening Schools – 3 hrs

- C) Antiques & Collectibles
- D) Art
- E) Baking
- F) Canning and Home Preserves
- **G)** Crafts (e.g. scrapbooking, cards, paper tole, tole painting, jewelry, other current craft trends, etc.)
- H) Fruits
- I) Junior Work/School Work/Posters
- J) Knitting & Crochet
- **K)** Organized Groups Displays (Community groups [i.e. 4-H, Women's Institute, Rotary, etc.], Commercial, Yard or Farm Displays)
- L) Photography
- M) Quilts (hand and machine quilting) Note: if a Judging School is working with a larger number of sample quilts and/or larger number of students they might require more than 3 hours for the school
- N) Sewing (clothing, smocking, fabric arts)
- O) Vegetables, Roots, and Garlic
- P) Woodwork (carving, building, turning, burning)

<u>Under review</u> – the OAAS is working to determine what is required for these categories

- **Q) Wine and Beer –** need to create Judging Standards
- **R) Maple Syrup** working with Maple Syrup Association to update Judging Standards and create a Judging School
- **S)** Honey working with Ontario Honey Association to update Judging Standards and create a Judging School
- T) Flowers working with OHA to determine how to move forward
- U) Produce (Eggs, Dairy)
